Resuming Sunday Worship Services:

We are excited and grateful to be worshiping again as a Church Family. On Sunday, June 14th, we will resume *our Sunday Morning Worship services*. Below is a description as well as guidelines we will follow beginning June 14:

We will offer three worship services. The services will be as follows:
 8am Traditional worship with communion.
 9:15am Blended of contemporary and traditional worship.
 10:30am Contemporary worship service.
Due to state guidelines each service is limited to 25% capacity, which is roughly 90 people per service.
At this point no RSVP is needed to come to a service.
For the foreseeable future, we will have no Sunday school, Sunday morning Bible Studies or nursery.
We have an adjusted seating plan to accommodate additional spacing for personal distancing. We ask that family
units sit together and do their best to social distance from other families and attenders.
We will have signs posted as needed, and have hand sanitizers strategically placed throughout the
building.
Volunteers will be opening the doors for people to limit contact with surfaces.
We ask that you refrain from shaking hands and limit congregating in our welcome area.
We will have a designated place for you to drop off your offering.
For everyone's safety, if you are sick, or not feeling well, we ask that you stay home.
We have developed a deep cleaning strategy (which we are already doing for our Sunday time of praise
reflection, and communion) that will stay in place.
Though there is a mandatory "wear a mask in public places" policy in affect in Minneapolis, our
sanctuary is considered private property and we will let you, the congregation member, decide. We will
have masks available for those who desire them.
