



2 Timothy Study Guide. Read through the assigned portion of Scripture several times during the week and then use the questions to help you dive deeper into the Text. Remember to pray and ask God to reveal how these verses apply to your life today.

Week 1-October 18-24: Read 2 Timothy 1:1-18

Study Questions:

- Verse 1 What was Paul called to be, how was he called to this, and what was the purpose of his calling?
- Verses 2-5 How does Paul assure Timothy of his deep love for him? Why was Paul so eager to express these things to Timothy?
- Verse 6 What does Paul urge Timothy to do with God's gift? How would he go about doing this?
- Verse 7 Instead of fearfulness or timidity, explain the three characteristics of the Spirit God has given every believer? How do they overcome timidity?
- Verse 9 How, why, when, and by whom did God determine to call us to Himself? What kind of calling is it?
- Verse 12 Why was Paul not ashamed to suffer for Christ?
- Verse 14 What are you to guard? How do you do this? By what power can you do this?
- How do these verses apply to your life today? What promise can you hold onto? What step of obedience is God asking you to take? How can you stand with courage?*

Week 2- October 25- 31: Read 2 Timothy 2:1-13

Study Questions:

- Verse 1 In what did Paul want Timothy to be strong? How would this help Timothy? How does it help you?
- Verse 2 What was Timothy to entrust to other men? What kind of men should he be looking for? How does this verse apply in the local church?
- Verses 3-4 How does Paul compare a believer to a soldier?
- Verse 5 What do you learn from athletics that will help you in your Christian life?
- Verse 6 What does farming have in common with living for Christ?
- Verses 7-8 What did Paul urge Timothy to remember?
- Verses 11-13 What happens if we deny Christ? What happens if we are faithless? What is the difference?
- How do these verses apply to your life today? What promise can you hold onto? What step of obedience is God asking you to take? How can you stand with courage?*

Week 3- November 8-14: Read 2 Timothy 2:14-24

Study Questions:

- Verse 14 What was Timothy supposed to charge the believers in Ephesus to do? Why?
- Verse 15 How was Timothy to present himself to God? What was required to do this? How do you apply this verse to your own life?
- Verse 19 What two truths does God's firm foundation have on it? How does this fit into the context of this chapter?
- Verse 22 What should we flee from and what should we pursue? How should we call on the Lord?
- Verses 23-25 What are five characteristics of the Lord's servant as we seek to correct others?
- Verses 25-26 What might God do in the hearts of people who have been rejecting His truth?
- How do these verses apply to your life today? What promise can you hold onto? What step of obedience is God asking you to take? How can you stand with courage?*

Week 4- November 15- 21: Read 2 Timothy 3:1-17

Study Questions:

- Verse 1 What can you be sure will be coming in the last days?
- Verse 5 How is a believer supposed to respond to people like this? Why?
- Verses 10-11 What practices of Paul's life did Timothy follow? How does this describe discipleship?
- Verse 12 What will most certainly happen to those who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus? How does this encourage you?
- Verse 14 In what was Timothy to continue?
- Verse 15 Why are the sacred writings so important? What do they teach you?
- How do these verses apply to your life today? What promise can you hold onto? What step of obedience is God asking you to take? How can you stand with courage?*

Week 5- November 22-28: 2 Timothy 4:1-22

Study Questions:

- Verse 1 Why does Paul solemnly charge Timothy to preach the Word?
- Verse 3 What will people not endure or put up with in time to come? What will they want instead?
- Verse 4 From what will people turn their ears, and to what will they turn aside? Can you identify any of these in our day?
- Verses 6-7 What does Paul know is coming soon? How does he describe his life?
- Verse 8 What is Paul looking forward to? What other kind of people will experience this?
- Verses 14-15 What was the problem with Alexander the Coppersmith?
- Verses 16-17 What happened at Paul's first defense?
- Verse 17 What was Paul's biggest concern at his hearing?
- Verses 17-18 How did Paul see God in his trial in the midst of his defense?
- How do these verses apply to your life today? What promise can you hold onto? What step of obedience is God asking you to take? How can you stand with courage?*
